Small groups are an essential ingredient in the church body for spiritual growth and connection on a personal level. Connection and growth is not achievable by simply attending church once a week. So, Christian groups of some kind are good for you and they are *GOOD FOR THE KINGDOM?* Groups strengthen the Body of Christ and make a landing pad for seekers and new believers as well as the mature Christian. Groups are a sincere, authentic place of love and support and... if facilitated with intention and purpose, they can be an instrument used by God for His "Kingdom Come" agenda! This is only the case if your group is willing to accept the "Kingdom Come" agenda and humbly embrace the value of multiplication.

Multiplication?

Multiplication....remember that? I am a language person and steer away from math, but I understand the Kingdom call to multiply!

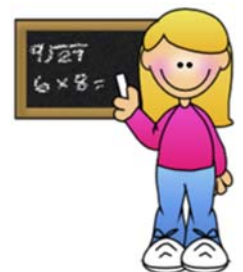
Essentially that means that we need to be continually evaluating our groups and encouraging group members to break off and start new groups.

Additionally many are mortified to physically move away from a group to start a new group in new soil! This begs the question, which agenda are you dedicated too: "Kingdom Come" or "Holy Huddle"? When we stand before Jesus on our day of glory-*I wonder if He will ask us that.*

The Equip Team would like you to ponder that question deep in your heart.

We would like group leaders of all kinds to discuss with those in your "Holy Huddle" group and glean how you could be instrumental in God's "Kingdom Come" agenda. Prayerfully consider unlocking your arms to let others in or, courageously encourage some to break off and birth a new group. Please reach out to the Equip Team if you sense God nudging you to..... multiply.
